About IIPHS:

The Indian Institute of Public Health Shillong (IIPHS) is a northeast regional institute of public health. It was established in 2015 by the PHFI in collaboration with the Government of Meghalaya to redress the limited institutional and systems capacity in public health in the Northeast Region of India. In August 2020, IIPHS became an autonomous institution of the IIPHS Society registered under the Meghalaya Societies Registration Act 1983. The mission of IIPHS is to advance equitable health and well-being by fostering a culture of excellence in education, research, and praxis.

Project Brief:

The Regional Resource Hub for Health Technology Assessment in India (RRH-HTAIn) at IIPH Shillong in collaboration with the Department of Health Research (DHR), Government of India is undertaking HTA analysis on behalf of MoHFW. The purpose of HTAIn is to support informed policy-making through economic evaluation, cost-effectiveness analysis, and related HTA studies.

Roles and responsibilities:

- Travel to field sites to collect and record data appropriate to the project's specific objectives.
- Coordinate survey logistics, including scheduling, mapping out survey locations, and managing transportation arrangements.
- Review and edit data to ensure completeness and accuracy of information; follow up with subjects to resolve problems or clarify data collected.
- Provide regular progress updates to the Project Coordinator/Supervisor and participate in team meetings to discuss study outcomes, challenges, and potential modifications to the research approach.
- Performs miscellaneous job-related duties as assigned.
- Perform any other duties as assigned by supervisor.

Essential Qualification

- Master's degree in public health (MPH) or a related discipline (MSW, Health Management, Hospital Administration, Community Health, Nursing, or Allied Health Sciences)
- Or Bachelor's degree with experience in field data collection and conducting interviews

Desirable

- Prior experience working in health facilities
- Basic computer skills (Excel/Google Sheets)
- Working knowledge of data collection CAPI apps (KOBO, ODK etc)
- Fluency in local language (Khasi or Garo) and basic English
