About IIPHS:

The Indian Institute of Public Health Shillong (IIPHS) is a northeast regional institute of public health. It was established in 2015 by the Public Health Foundation of India in collaboration with the Government of Meghalaya to redress the limited institutional and systems capacity in public health in the North East Region of India. IIPHS mandates include research interdisciplinary education and advocacy.

Project Brief:

The Indian Institute of Public Health, Shillong is establishing the Zoonotic and Vector-Borne Diseases (ZVBD) in Northeast India: a Trans-Disciplinary Research and Training Centre in collaboration with the Wellcome Trust/DBT and India Alliance. There are several objectives in this project. The main objectives are to understand epidemiology of Zoonotic and Vector-Borne Diseases (ZVBD) in Northeast India, to establish and foster a ZVBD training and research centre to coordinate and strengthen research and training capacity for clinicians and public health personnel, while promoting post-graduate training, to characterize and evaluate risk factor patterns that facilitate transmission of regional ZVBDs by implementing population-based, clinical and epidemiological studies to identify the hidden burden of undiagnosed infection and to monitor and forecast disease trends to enhance early cross-species detection of ZVBD outbreaks and Transboundary Animal Diseases

Job Description:

The Project Research Scientist-II (Non-Medical) will oversee the overall management and execution of the project, ensuring its successful implementation and impact. This role involves planning and coordinating interventions, developing content, and engaging with the community. The candidate will also supervise project activities, create educational materials, and lead risk communication and community mobilization efforts.

Essential Qualification:

Master's Degree in Public Health (MPH), Master's of Social Work (MSW), Master's in Digital Communication Management, Mass Communication Programme or a related discipline.

Work Experience:

- At least 3-4 years of experience in project management, with a focus on health-related projects, is desirable.
- Relevant experience includes managing health programs, healthcare projects, or public health initiatives
- Experience in developing and implementing health interventions and community engagement strategies.

Desirable Qualifications and Experience:

- Proven experience in developing IEC/BCC materials and training modules.
- Demonstrated ability to lead and manage project teams effectively.
- Experience in risk communication and community mobilization is highly desirable.
